

# Louis Aebischer Is Pneumonia Victim Early This Morning

His Death Comes as Tragic Shock  
To Mother, also in Hospital

The sudden death of Louis Aebischer, 28-year-old only son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Aebischer, occurred at 3:00 this morning, Thursday, May 7, 1936, at the Palmdale Hospital, from double bronchial pneumonia.

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at 2:00 at the home at Alpine Springs. A number of his former schoolmates will serve as pallbearers.

Louis' death comes as a tragic shock to his parents and his bride of a few months. His mother was operated on the first of the week in the Palmdale Hospital, and though she was recovering in fine shape, has been in quite serious condition since she was told of her son's death.

Taken sick Tuesday night, Louis was removed to the hospital Wednesday morning and placed in an adjoining room to that occupied by his mother. He was quite sick during the night and died about three o'clock. Shortly before his death he asked about his mother.

Louis Pierre Aebischer was born February 15, 1908, in Geneva, Switzerland, so was 28 years old at the time of his death. He was educated in schools in Switzerland; Paris, France; Montreal, Canada; and the United States. The family came to Antelope Valley in 1919, buying the Alpine Springs property two miles south of Palmdale, which they developed into a cabin and gas station resort. Louis graduated from the A. V. J. U. High School and since then has lived at home. For a year or so he operated a large freight truck, and the last few months has been working on a ranch.

Louis was married September 10 of last year to Miss Marcile Homer, of Clinton, Minn., niece of Mrs. Jonathon Matthews of Palmdale.
