Mrs. Mattie Hubbard, who died Apr. 15 at Mrs. Black's Rest Home in Palmdale was one of Acton's oldest residents, both in years and in length of residence here.

She was interred in the Acton Cemetery on Apr. 17.

Services were at the Chapel of the Valley in Palmdale with Rev. Hugh Foster, pastor of the Community Presbyterian Church of Acton, in charge.

Mrs. Hubbard was born Jan. 18, 1872, in Goldfield, Iowa, the only child of Rev. John Robbins and Mary Melrose Robbins.

The Rev. Robbins was the non-denominational minister here until his death on Oct. 18, 1923.

Mattie Robbins was married to Arthur S. Hubbard on May 3, 1899, by the Rev. Silas Pruden at the home of her parents near Acton. Mr. Hubbard was for 33 years the county road foreman for this district and died while at work in Soledad Canyon on July 18, 1933.

Mattie Hubbard survived her husband by almost 25 years which she spent here, active in the Acton church work serving as Sunday school teacher as long as her health permitted. There were no children and she is survived by four cousins, Miss Ethel Clingan who lives at the family home on Sierra Highway near Acton; her brother, William Clingan of Orange Cove; Mrs. D. C. Ward, Los Angeles, and Mrs. G. W. Van Buskirk, San Bernardino.
