

Albert Foster Zink J. B. Zink's Father Passed December 10

Albert Foster Zink, father of J. Boyd Zink, of Littlerock, passed away at his home in Long Beach, December 10, at age 62. It was known that he was in rather poor health, but no alarm was felt until his family was summoned to his bedside. He suffered a stroke, from which he never fully rallied.

Last rites were held at the Community church, Palmdale, on Thursday, December 13, at 1 p. m., Rev. Harvey A. Hood, officiating. Mr. Charles Ritchie rendered a musical selection beloved by the departed.

Many old time friends paid last tribute not only by their presence but by many lovely floral offerings.

Albert Foster Zink was born in Washington county, Indiana, May 2, 1862, the son of Hiram and Sarah Zink. He lived on a farm until the time of his marriage.

In 1896 he was married to Cora Boling, and together they moved to Western Kansas, where they settled on a cattle ranch. His wife preceded him in death in 1897.

He came to Southern California in 1905, and in 1909 took up ranching and mining in Littlerock. For the last three years he has made his home with a son in Long Beach.

There remain to mourn his loss three sons: Earl, of Las Vegas, Nevada; Claire, of Long Beach, and Boyd, of Littlerock; two daughters: Mrs. Max Van Hall, of Denver and Mrs. Donald Agge, of Leeds, England, and thirteen grandchildren.

Three sons and one daughter were in the military service of the country during the World War.
