Mr. Ericsson came west in 1910, locating in Los Angeles, and later in Pomona where he was in the livery stable business. He then moved to Corona, and later to Ontario. He came to Littlerock in 1928, and has operated, with the help of his sons, pear orchards there since that time.

He was married December 25, 1893, to Miss Frances C. Shade, in Gothenburg, Nebraska, and she with their nine children survive. Mrs. Ericsson is now living with a daughter, Mrs. Ruth C. Keller, of
